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This rulebook is not intended to cover all aspects of the Road America Karting Club; it will be used as a guide unless it is a clear-cut decision and will be used in conjunction with the WKA rules book.

### 1. General Rules

#### 1.1 Waivers:

- EVERYONE is required to complete an Adult or Minor waiver to enter Road America property. This can be done when you arrive at the track or by using a SpeedWaiver in advance.
- Minor waivers MUST completed for all minors entering Road America regardless of age.
- ALL participants MUST have completed waiver, and entry fees paid prior to participating in practice or competing in any races. Note: proof of age is required for all minors.

#### 1.2 Parents reasonability for minors:

- Parents or Guardians must sign a waiver and are to be responsible for any children they brought to the races.
- Example; Do not let them run around unsupervised.

### 1.3 Spectators:

- Spectators are NOT allowed on the Pre-grid, HOT grid or on Track during the event.
- A Driver or Pit Pass wristband is required to gain access to Pre-grid, Hot Grid or Track.

### 1.4 Grid & Hot track Restrictions:

- Smoking is prohibited on the Pre-grid, Hot grid and on Track
- Fueling is prohibited on the Pre-grid, Hot grid and on Track
- Pets are NOT allowed on the Pre-grid, Hot grid and on Track

### 1.5 Hot track access:

 Anyone entering the track MUST ONLY enter through the gate by the Flag stand and ONLY after getting prior approval from a RAKC official.

### 1.5.1 Hot track access - Age restrictions:

- No one under the age of sixteen can enter the track during practice or racing unless they are accompanied by a parent or guardian.
- This includes volunteer corner workers, flaggers and drivers spectating.

### 1.5.2 Hot track access - Camera/Phone Restrictions

- No cameras or cell phones can be used on the track by corner workers.

### 1.6 Restricted Areas: - Entering Timing & Scoring building:

- No one can enter the timing and scoring building without permission from a race official.

### 1.7 Unsportsmanlike conduct:

- Unsportsmanlike conduct, abusive and/or foul language, fighting, refused cooperation, will not be tolerated
- Anyone exhibiting such conduct will be disqualified from the event and required to leave the facility and is subject to further disciplinary action.

#### 1.8 Social Media:

- Posts on blogs or social media sites such as Facebook that reflect poorly on Road America Karting Club, fellow competitors, and/or the sport of karting are unacceptable and may result in disciplinary actions at the discretion of Road America. Differences of opinion regarding Road America Karting Club rules and regulations, decisions by Road America Karting Club Officials, Road America Karting Club policies, or between other competitors are best resolved privately and directly between the parties involved. Penalties for violations may include suspension from Road America Karting Club Competition.

### 1.9 Alcohol:

- Alcoholic beverages are NOT allowed on the grid or track during any events.
- No driver or crew member can drink alcoholic beverages during an event.
- Alcohol consumption is only allowed after the driver or crew members are done racing and in a responsible manner.

### 2. Safety Rules

### 2.1 Kart & Pit area Safety:

- Driver & Crew are always responsible for safety of their kart and pit area.
- They must keep all non-crew people away from any running or hot karts.
- Note: Stay clear of any rotating parts i.e., wheels, chains, stay clear of any hot parts i.e., exhaust pipes, brake rotors etc.

### 2.2 Starting engine:

- Driver must be in kart prior to starting engine or Kart must be on a secure kart stand.

### 2.3 Driving karts safely

- No kart driving outside of marked hot grid and karts will be at a minimal speed until on track.
- Drivers must always operate their kart in a safe manner and adhere to all flags and instructions given while on track.
- On-track "tire scrubbing" is NOT allowed.
   Anyone determined to be "scrubbing tires" by the Flagman or Race Official will be penalized.
   The penalty will be at the discretion of the Race Director.
- When exiting the track, slow down until you are at a safe minimal speed, check brakes, stop short of kart in front of you by 3 or 4 feet, turn off engine and push kart over scales.

### 2.3.1 Driving karts in the pits:

- No driving of karts in the pit area.
- Karts can only be driven when leaving the grid, on track and slowly entering the scale area. Karts need to be pushed to the grid and pushed to the scale on the exit lane.

### 2.3.2 Rough Driving:

- Rough driving will not be tolerated at any time.
- Anyone intentionally bumping, hitting, chopping, blocking, or driving in an out-of-control manner, will be warned, penalized, disqualified, or suspended depending on the severity of the incident.

### 2.4 Mechanical problems:

- Drivers must use hand signals to warn other karts (put one hand straight-up not out to the side of kart) attempt to get off racing surface in a safe manner, if a brake failure occurs do not pull into pits, drive around until kart is at a slow enough speed to safely pull off.

### 2.5 Disabled karts:

- Attempt to move the kart farther away from the racing surface to a safer area if possible.

### 2.6 Additional weight:

All added weights must be painted white and securely fastened (5/16 bolt min. double nutted or pinned) and a 40mm washer under the head of the bolt or conical washer. (See photo). When fastening weights to your kart, there must be a minimum of 1/8 inch beyond the last retaining nut if double nutted.



- If a single weight or combined weights are greater than 10.5 pounds, a single 3/8" inch bolt or two 5/16" inch bolts must be used.

### 2.6.1 Losing Weight:

- Any competitor losing weight while on track will receive the following penalty.
  - 1) During Practice, loses next round of practice
  - 2) During the last round of practice, two position grid penalty for heat
  - 3) During qualifying, heat, or feature is a DQ

### 2.7 Drivers Safety Gear Requirements:

- Helmet (Full Face) with hard shield. (See 2.7.1)
- Racing suit or racing jacket with long abrasion-resistant pants.
- Proper driving shoes (no sandals or loafers).
- Gloves: full coverage of hand, made of suitable material.
- Neck collar: racing type
- Rib/chest protectors (See 2.7.3)

### 2.7.1 Helmet (Full Face) with a hard shield:

- Snell Rated: M 2015, SA 2015, CMS 2016 & CMR 2016 (Youth) or higher rating
- SFI Rated: 24.1 2015, 31.1 2015, 31.1A 2015, 41.1 2015 or higher rating

### 2.7.2 Helmet mounted recording devices:

- Mounting any recording device to outside or inside of helmet is prohibited.
- Anyone using a helmet mounted recording device will receive a major penalty and forfeit all points for that race.

### 2.7.3 Rib/chest protectors

- An SFI rated chest protectors are required for drivers in the Kid Kart, Cadet & Sportsman classes.
- HIGHLY Recommended that all drivers wear rib or chest protectors.

#### 2.8 Corner Workers:

- We need volunteer corner workers for each race.
- Volunteer corner workers need to have a Driver or Pit Pass wristband.
- A minimum of three corner workers must be on the track before the race can begin.

### 2.9 Pre-Tech safety check:

- All karts must have a Pre-Tech safety check and receive chassis band, before getting on track for practice or competing in races.
- It is your responsibility to keep all safety equipment intact during the entire season, a safety check may be done at any time during the season.

### 2.10 Rookies Drivers:

- For all classes inexperienced drivers may have to start at the rear of the field until approved by the Race Director. For first year drivers in the ALL classes, you must have a visible X on the back of their helmet (use yellow or other contrasting colored tape). If driver's actions are found to be unsafe, participant may be asked to attend 2-3 practice days, before being approved to race, at Race Director's discretion.

### 2.11 Starting at the back of the grid:

- Any driver may request to start at the rear of the field.
- If you feel your equipment or ability may impede the rest of the field it is recommended you start in the back until you feel comfortable.
- If you prefer to start at the back of the grid, please let timing and scoring know.

### 2.12 Race Director - Safety authority:

 The Race Director has the authority to ban or remove any driver from a class in the case of a safety issue

### 2.13 Driver Responsibilities:

- All Drivers are responsible for meeting the rules and regulations for the track. Failure to do so may result in a disqualification.
- Drivers are also responsible for the actions of their crew.
- You can purchase a WKA rule book at worldkarting.com in the store under printed materials or ask the Race Director to view the WKA rule book.

### 3. Class Requirements

### 3.1 Detailed class rules:

- Refer to: Road America Karting Club - 2025 Class Rules document (Pages 14 - 15)

### 3.2 Age:

- Age as of May 1<sup>st</sup> determines the class in which you are eligible to compete. Requests to move up a class, driver must be within one year of age class and have approval by Race Director.

### 3.3 Engines:

- Engines are subject to tech inspection at any time; refusal of inspection from tech official will be Immediate disqualification of points for the entire season and may result in a suspension.
- Engine/Chassis change: If a competitor must change an engine or chassis, both engines/chassis
  are subject to technical inspection. Tech officials must be notified prior to change of engine or
  chassis. The replaced engine or chassis must be presented to tech officials upon installing the
  replacement. The competitor will be required to start at the back of the grid for the next race.
- Note: Only Briggs 206 engines with an ORANGE seal will be eligible for competition in the 2025 season.

### 3.4 Tires:

- MG Tire is Official Tire for the Road America Karting Club & Briggs & Stratton Motorplex
- See "Road America Karting Club 2025 Class Rules" document. For the required tire compounds
- Wire brushing or scraping to remove debris or rubber build up is allowed.
- Only untreated tires are allowed. No altering of ANY kind allowed.
   This includes: No washing or cleaning of tires at Road America. Application of chemical mixtures/sprays, heating/cooling blankets, and/or any other tire applicant is not allowed.

### 3.4.1 Tire Changing:

- Changing tires after qualifying or after a scored session is NOT permitted. Changing tires without the approval of a Race official will result in a DQ and zero points for that race.
- Only the damaged tires can be replaced and require approval from the Race Director prior to the tire being changed, and only the damaged tire can be replaced.

### 3.4.2 Tire Testing:

- Tire testing may include, but is not limited to, any combination of the following practices: comparing durometer readings, visual inspection, sniffer testing, painting inside, lab testing.
- The Race Director will make a final decision on tire legality or may impose a warning or impound tire(s) for storage.
- Minimum penalty for violating the tire-treatment ban will be a suspension for 30 days or the next two RAKC points races, whichever is greater. Suspension days will include non-race days.
- Suspensions cannot be used as drop races. Penalties for subsequent violations of the tiretreatment ban will increase in severity and be dealt with at the discretion of the Race Director.

### 3.5 Fuel Testing:

- No additives of any kind are allowed (any derivatives of nitro or oxidizers are illegal).
- Fuel may be tested using a Digitron fuel meter (spec oil is Burris Castor or Burris Blend, no oil spec for TAG, DD2 & Shifter classes).
- All 4 cycle gas classes must use gas station pump gas (must retain natural color) NO racing gas, NO adding of methanol or any other liquid fuel (must remain as it came from the pump) water testing and lab testing may be done.
- The penalty for illegal fuel is a non-droppable disqualification.

### - Spec Fuel for all Briggs 206 Classes:

- -BP <u>Regular 87 gasoline</u> from R-Store BP Station. 1232 Co Rd O Plymouth, WI 53073 OR
- -BP Regular 87 gasoline from Marshalls One Stop 510 E Rhine St Elkhart Lake, WI 53020
- -Test range will be plus or minus 10 on the Digitron fuel meter to tech sample -

### 3.6 Clutches:

- No axle clutches allowed. Briggs 206 Classes must adhere to Briggs Ruleset.
  - 4 cycle classes: any dry type of clutch is allowed.
  - All other classes must use WKA authorized clutches.

### 3.7 Mufflers:

- All classes must use unaltered authorized mufflers, must be removable from pipe (not welded on).
- 4 cycle classes must use an RLV #B91 muffler.
- Yamaha Sportsman class must use RLV #7543 (4 holes spaced between 12 and 3 o'clock) or RLV #7548 (4 holes spaced 90 degrees of each other).
- Yamaha Lite and Heavy classes must use a RLV SR-Y pipe with a #9110 header.

### 3.8 Bodywork:

- All karts must have bodywork (nose & side pods minimum) to be allowed on the track. Bodywork must conform to either WKA Manufactures Cup or Gold Cup specifications.
- All bodywork must be CIK style. All 2-Cycle and 4-Cycle classes must run bodywork that is CIK in appearance and legal to "Manufacturers Cup" rules as set forth in the current WKA Tech Manual.

#### 3.9 Bumpers:

- Full width rear bumpers (plastic or steel) are required.

Front, rear bumpers and nerf bars must be made from round steel tubing (0.63 O.D. x .065 wall minimum) and all corners must have a radius (no sharp edges & no square tubing).

#### 3.10 Numbers:

- Karts must have their number on all four sides, a minimum of five inches tall and visible to Race Officials.

#### 3.10.1 Duplicate Kart Numbers:

- Duplicate Kart numbers are not allowed in the same class.
- When you register for your RAKC Membership you will select your preferred Kart number.
- RAKC members from the previous year will be able keep their kart number if they purchase their membership by March 1<sup>st</sup>. After March 1<sup>st</sup> all remaining available kart numbers will be available and the first member to register will be given priority.
- On Race Day, if two karts in the same class have the same Kart number. Priority will be given to the RAKC Member, the non-members will be asked to change their kart number.

### 3.11 Seat placement:

- No seat can be located behind the vertical plane at the rear of the rear axle. This is checked when kart is on the ground by placing a square up against the rear surface of the axle.

### 3.12 Club Sponsor Decal:

- RAKC members may be required to place a series sponsor sticker on their kart. (Club Sponsor sticker would be provided)

### 4. Race Day Procedures

### 4.1 Race Day Registration:

- Registration slips must be turned into Timing & Scoring before you go on track or no later than:
  - Weekend Series Day Races: 11:00am
  - Weekend Series Night Races: 4:15pm
  - Weeknight Series: 4:30pm

### 4.1.1 Registration cutoff times:

- Tuesday Night Series cutoff time is 5:30 pm.
- Weekend Series cutoff time is 11:30am (4:30 pm for night races).

  If you know you will not be able to have the registration slip turned in by the cutoff time.
  - Please reach out to the Chief of timing and scoring prior to race day.
- Turning in registration slip late will result in having to start the back of both heats.

### 4.2 Pitting on the asphalt:

- No pitting on the asphalt, only on grass or gravel areas.
- Pit stalls are NOT reserved and are filled on a first come first served basis.
- Teams observed pitting on the asphalt will receive either a verbal and/or written warning from the Race Director for the race day. Subsequent offenses will result in penalties assigned at the discretion of the Race Director, increasing in severity with each offense (examples: starting at the back of the days races, no points for the day, asked to leave the Road America grounds)

### 4.3 Pre-Tech:

- All karts must pass pre-tech along with the driver safety gear prior to being allowed on track.
- NOTE:

Passing pre-tech is in no way a guarantee of class legality or technical compliance. Furthermore, this test in no way guarantees any rule legality and is solely intended as a safety inspection. Pre-Tech does not replace race required tech inspections.

#### 4.4 Practice:

- Practice will be broken into Race Groups
- Each group will get a minimum of two practice sessions.

### 4.5 Race Format:

- Weeknight Series:
  - 2 Heat races 6 laps (All Classes)
  - 1 Feature race 10 laps (All Classes)
- Weekend Series:
  - 2 Heat races 5 laps each (Kid Karts Heat races are 6 laps each)
  - 1 Feature race 10 laps (All Classes)

### 4.5.1 Race Format - Split Heats:

- If any class has fourteen or more entries Heats races may be split into A and B heats.

### 4.6 Multi-Class Race Grouping:

- Classes may be grouped with another class, with like speed, but will be scored separately.
- In most cases, each class will be a separate pack and will have a split start.

### 4.7 Race grid positions:

- Heat race grid position:

Heat 1 - Random draw by computer, qualifying or qualifying with dice roll to determine positions inverted.

Heat 2 - Inverted positions from starting position in Heat 1.

When qualifying, or qualifying with dice roll invert, the finish of Heat 1 determines the grid for Heat 2.

### Feature race grid position:

Is based on points earned in the heat races, the kart with most points starts on pole.

- In the event of a tie in points, the faster lap in qualifying will determine the starting position.
- With no qualifying the faster lap time in either heat will get the higher starting position.
- Pole position can decide to start on the inside or outside of the front row.

#### 4.7.1 No-Show on Grid:

- When a kart does not show up to the grid for a race. The line of karts directly behind the missing kart move up one row.

#### 4.8 Transponders:

Timing and scoring will use the AMB TranX 160 transponder system.
 It is your responsibility to have a charged and working transponder on your kart.

#### 4.8.1 Transponder Placement:

The transponder must be mounted securely and safely to the left side pod of the kart.
 The transponder must be vertically mounted a minimum of nine inches back from the kingpin bolt of the spindle to the front side of the transponder.

### 4.8.2 Transponder Rental:

- We have a limited number of rental transponders.
  - Transponder are rented on a first come first serve basis.
  - Transponders are rented for \$15 at Gate 4 & picked up in the Timing & Scoring building.
  - A Credit Card or Driver's License is **REQUIRED** and will be held for deposit when transponder is picked up in the Timing & Scoring building.

### 4.9 Driver's responsibilities on race starts:

- Kart in pole position shall set a reasonable pace to the starting cone.

#### 4.10 Starts:

- The Flagman has control of the race start. If there is a waved off start caused by the front row karts, one more attempt will be made, if they were the cause of another waved off start, they (both karts) shall be placed in the back row of the field.
- There is to be no pushing, bumper-to-bumper contact or dropping back to get a run and pull out of line on the start. Drivers must stay in the tram lines until they have reached the yellow ending line. Drivers caught will receive a two position post-race penalty at minimum. In most cases, the attempt at a start will not be waived off for drivers pushing.
- For split group starts the race director reserves the right to impose a penalty for jumping the start. Penalties may include a warning, position penalty or disqualification depending on the severity of the incident.
- The Race Director may implement a standing start for any problematic race group(s).

### 4.11 Restarts:

- Restarts after a red flag will revert to the most current order of the last completed lap.
  - If no laps were completed the field would revert to the original grid order.
  - A lap is completed when all karts on lead lap have passed the finish line.

### 4.12 Scaling:

- All karts must be scaled after every race to be scored for that race, any kart that does not get scaled or does not meet minimum class weight will receive zero points for that race.
- If you fail to make weight you will be able to pull off scale and have another competitor weigh in, then try one more time, if you fail to make minimum weight again and the scale if deemed accurate by the scale operator, you will receive zero points for that race.
- To retain your position in the next race the kart must be rescaled before the next race and certified by the scale operator to be at a legal weight, otherwise you will start at the back of the grid.

### 4.12.1 Unauthorized entry into Scale area.

- The Driver is the only person allowed in scale area, except for Kid Karts.
- Unauthorized entry into the scale area could lead to a penalty or disqualification.

### 4.13 Flagging

- For further flagging clarification, see RAKC Flags & Definition document (Page 16)

### 4.13.1 Yellow flags:

- Standing Yellow is displayed as a warning: (Problem is off track or in next sector)
   Example: disabled kart(s) ahead but not on racing surface. No Passing is allowed until past the reason for the standing yellow.
- Waving Yellow flag is displayed: (Problem in this sector)

  The driver must slow down, NO passing is allowed until past the reason for the waving yellow.

  Look ahead for flagging instructions or hand instructions.

### 4.13.2 Black Flag:

- Any kart that is black flagged during the race must safely exit the track on the exit lane and report to the scale, the driver will then be informed by a Race Director of the infraction that caused the black flag & what action will be taken for the infraction, which could include position penalty (last place points) or zero points for that race.
- A rolled up black flag may be shown to a driver who is one incident away from being penalized. No
  penalty has been issued at this point, but further infractions will result in penalties. This warning
  is not required and is considered a courtesy to the driver.
- Any repeat offenders are subject to a non-droppable disqualification or race suspension.

### 4.13.3 Sportsmanship Flag:

- The Sportsmanship flag (Black and White diagonal flag) may be used to notify a driver of a position penalty during a race. There is no guarantee of the usage of the sportsmanship flag. It is a courtesy from race officials. It may not always be possible for officials to utilize the flag in a timely manner, especially in shorter heat races. If a penalty is for avoidable contact, unsportsmanlike driving, or blocking has been called in the race, the flag will be displayed to the driver who has committed the penalty along with a white board by the starter at the start/finish line for two laps. The offending driver has the option to adhere to the penalty and place themselves in the correct running order completely behind the kart that the infraction occurred upon. If the driver adheres to the penalty during the race, the penalty will be removed and acknowledged by race officials immediately and the drivers can go back to racing like normal. If the driver does not adhere to the Sportsmanship flag, the effected driver(s) will be notified of the penalty at scales.

#### 4.14 Rain outs:

- If the heat races for all the classes have been completed the race day is complete
- If within two heats of finishing all heats, the two heats will be run before the next race day to make the previous race day official.
- Points for rained out features will be determined by your grid position from the heat races.
- After a rain delay, lap totals for races may be lowered due to time restraints.
- If the race is rained out and cannot be made up, it will be dropped from the schedule. This means you would still drop another race.

#### 4.15 Protests:

- All protests must be presented to the race director. They must be in writing and be within 30 minutes of the driver/handler being informed of the offence or incident, whichever is longer.
- Note: approaching any other official could lead to disqualification.
   Example: Yelling at the Scale worker, Chief of Timing & Scoring or the Flagman will not be tolerated.

### 4.16 Video Footage:

- In the event of a protest, the RAKC race director (or designated official), may choose to review video evidence a competitor makes available. It is up to the competitor to obtain any videos for review
- Road America Karting Club reserves the right to request video footage from competitors that may depict an on-track incident for insurance purposes.

### 4.17 Penalties & Warnings:

- The Race Director reserves the right to impose warnings or penalties on any karts that have been seen first-hand or by an official, breaking any rules, including driving infractions.

### 5. RAKC Points

#### 5.1 Race Points:

Points earned from Heat Races and Feature Race then added together for total event points.

### 5.2 Points Qualification

- Any kart that receives the green flag under its own power will receive race points.
- Any kart that receives the Meatball flag (mechanical or safety) will receive race points.

### 5.3 Points Disqualification

- If any kart is found to be illegal after technical inspections, the driver will be disqualified.
- If found after qualifying or Heat races, the kart is only disqualified for that heat race.
- Once the technical issue has been rectified, the kart/driver will be allowed to return to the days racing, but will start in the back of the next session they participate in.
- If an infraction is found after the Feature, the disqualification is for the entire day.

### 5.4 Championships Points:

Championship Points are determined based on culminative points earned in each race. Both the Weeknight and Weekend series allow one drop per series.

### 5.4.1 Championship Points - Non-Droppable Race:

If disqualified in post-race technical inspection, you are not allowed to use that race as your drop.

### 5.4.2 Championship Points - Ties

Ties in season ending points will be decided by most feature wins, then on highest finishing position in the season ending feature race.

### 5.5 Years end trophy requirement:
